News from Longleaf

Did you know plastic bags are not accepted by local recycling companies? Not even the trash bag you used to tote your recyclables to the blue bin is allowed inside the bin. Many communities "up north" do allow these and other single use plastics to be recycled this way but as example Waste Pro has been known to impose fines on communities violating this requirement. Though it may be some time before Florida catches up, just about every supermarket and department store now offer bins near their entrances exactly for this purpose, but as a last resort pitch in trash, NOT with the recyclables.

Have you seen the commercials about "Keeping Lee Plastic Free?" Here at Foxmoor Lakes Community it is important to keep plastic bags, old plant pots and other plastics and trash out of the garden waste piles. The waste in these piles and along street edges will travel directly into a shredder to be recycled as mulch. In addition to keeping these unwanted materials out of mulch, when left out in the open they could collect water and lead to mosquito problems.

Plastics are a wonderful invention and have advanced so many technologies, but it is important to remember with their endurance comes longevity. Plastic bags are a leading cause of marine animal deaths, it is important to dispose of them properly especially when this region's economy depends so heavily on environment quality. Next time paper NOT plastic, and maybe remember to bring your own.
